Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Advent and Lent are both Seasons of the Church year focused on preparation. In Advent, we prepare to welcome the Son of God. Levels of anticipation, exuberance, and hopefulness are high. Church scholars remind us though, that without the Easter experience, Christmas may never have been recognized. Our anticipated celebration of Easter is more about an examined heart and a turn toward the Christ, the man who modeled peace, love, and justice in his every action. Preparing for a baby, buying gifts, and sharing hospitality evoke joy, delight, and pleasure. Reviewing our actions that might take Jesus to the cross again if he lived amongst us in 2019 is a different story.

The confidence we hold as Christians is that the grounding message of Jesus' death and resurrection is all about Forgiveness. We need to review our lives in search of whatever deeds we might have done - or failed to do - that contribute to areas of brokenness, confusion, or stress that we feel today. I know I have some confessions to make.

Our Lenten Theme is "*Transforming Chaos into Wholeness*." In Genesis 1, God started with Chaos. Some say there are traces, some say there are abundant oceans of chaos yet around us. Who wants to get comfortable with Chaos? Not me...! But that is where we start.

However, we don't need to stop there. Our national Self-Development of People program uses Isaiah to suggest that we might be repairers of the brokenness and restorers of the peace. Not because we know how to do that, but because the Lord will guide us. Our local sermon series will build on a series of topics that the world might consider weak: Prayer, Confrontation (in the style of Jesus), Hope, Vulnerability, Reconciliation, and Love, in search of what God might be wanting to do through us, here at 3413 Mt. Holly-Huntersville Road. The Apostle Paul wrote a lot about how God converts weaknesses into power, when we let God lead. I Cor. 1:18 and II Cor. 12:9 are worth reading.

My prayer for this Lent is that this wonderful, foundational, changing, thriving Body of Christ might listen deeply and experience God's Call for its direction. I have seen how you practice Philippians 4:8 and Ephesians 3:14. What is your prayer?
