Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Ubuntu is a beautiful concept. I first learned of it from a Ghanaian priest. It has grown in Western understanding largely due to Bishop Desmond Tutu's increased use of it when establishing the Truth and Reconciliation Commission. Wikipedia offers the same translation Fr. Patrick used: Ubuntu can be translated as "human kindness," but has a much bigger scope. It embodies the ideas of connection, community, and mutual caring for all. According to Liberian peace activist Leymah Gbowee, it means: "I am what I am because of who we all are."

The children, leaders, and teachers at Kajiado Children's Home, and all the supporting, sponsoring, spirit-giving members of Cook's Memorial and our sister churches, portray a wonderful illustration of Ubuntu practices. Because of your generosity, the nine of us who visited KCH delivered fifteen 50-pound suitcases filled with clothes, shoes, school supplies, reading glasses, bookbags, books, sports equipment, and vitamins for the School and children. With beaming smiles and sparkling eyes, <u>87</u> children and youth received your gifts.

I expected to be showered with appreciation. I did not expect to feel immersed in gratitude, embraced with love, and invited to experience floods of joyful enthusiasm. We all shared an exuberant wave of feeling up-lifted, buoyed by faith, and inspired by the trust, hope, and grace of these children.

Children generally have such an affect on us. These children are different. Not only are they orphans. Some have been rescued from forced marriages at age 12, some come from brutally abusive homes,

and others struggle with their own mental challenges. But these kids exude a thriving, supportive family system of caring for each



other throughout all their hardships, joys, and achievements. They sing and dance with dynamic energy - at worship, at evening devotions, the monthly birthday party, and while waiting in line before the next big event, whatever it may be.

I hope you receive a marked sense of fulfillment and a deep stream of Ubuntu for the prayers, gifts, and encouragement you shared and continue to direct to the Kajiado Children's Home. Their parting words during great hugs and some tears were: "God Bless You," and please convey our lasting appreciation and gratitude to our friends and sponsors at Cook's Memorial. What an amazing

reciprocal connection we are privileged to experience. I know my heart is still singing. Shalom,


