From October 6-9, I attended an Eviscerating Racism Conference. This conference talked about racism within the Presbytery as well as outside of the Presbytery. It has opened my eyes to how racism is still at large today in the church, in society, and how deeply rooted it is in many people's backgrounds. Here is just one thing that really stuck with me.

Before I went to this conference, I would hear things about race being a social construct but I didn't believe it. I thought since everyone has skin colors that are different, they can be categorized by them. I was ignorant. It was not until the 1600's that this concept was introduced. A French physician, François Bernier, decided to split people up by the color of people's skin. Five years later another French man, John Baptiste, decided the "whitest" skin was the most beautiful and it started to stick after 1720. John used the description of a woman from the caucus mountains as an example of how beautiful white skin is. This is where we get the word Caucasian.

One thing I will do is no longer check Caucasian on anything that asks me what "race" I am. I will simply check other and write human. Unless one is from the caucus mountains, there is no reason to use this word that has stayed within the systems for generations to keep everyone else in their place, below "white" people. The lighter the skin does not equal the better the person. Jesus would agree, as He was a person of color and He loves everyone equally.
