- Provide
 - Blessed to have a dad that was a "good provider"
 - Blessed to have a fortunate upbringing
 - Nice home, private school, gave us an appreciation for art and culture, taking us to NYC and other places
 - O But he, just like any dad, made mistakes while providing for us
 - Mixing Spaghetti O's and Mac n' Cheese
 - Burned it
 - o I've made myriad mistakes as a dad once sending my wife and kids to a birthday party location in a completely different town than the actual event was being held in.
 - Our Father in Heaven's provision never leaves us, never abandons us
 - Creation
 - Genesis 9:3 (Noah gets off the Ark) "Every moving thing that lives shall be food for you. And as I gave you the green plants, I give you everything."
 - **2 Corinthians 9:8** "And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work."
 - o Last week, we talked about the problem of scarcity. Knowing that God is a God of provision, as I said last week, scarcity may be a problem, but it isn't for Christians.

 - The problem of other minds
 - o We recognize that others love us more clearly when the forgive us!
 - **John 3:16** "For God so loved the world, that He gave his only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life."
 - o Ernest Hemingway "The Capitol of the World"
 - Story about second-tier bullfighters, each with talent, each not quite able to break into the major leagues, so to speak. The story reveals their backstories.
 - One of those young men ran away from home at a very early age. He wanted to be a bull fighter; his father wanted him to study law. Spanish father who wanted to be reconciled with his son who ran away from home to the city of Madrid. The father misses the son and puts an advertisement in the local newspaper El Liberal. The advertisement read, "Paco, meet me at the Hotel Montana at noon on Tuesday. All is forgiven! Love, Papa." Paco is such a common name in Spain that when the father went to the Hotel Montana the next day at noon there were 800 young men named Paco waiting for their fathers!
